Hayworth gathers significant backing from local and national business leaders

Dr. Nan Hayworth has received important new endorsements from business leaders in her quest to represent the 19th District in Congress.

Hayworth believes that growing jobs and reviving the economy are the most pressing issues we face. She received significant new backing from business leaders in recent days.
